

**National Platform on Disaster Risk Reduction Pre-event on
"Multi Hazard Community Capacity Building - Leave no one behind"
on 24 April 2017, New Delhi**

National Institute of Disaster Management in collaboration with Sphere, India organized a one day workshop as a pre event for National Platform for Disaster Risk reduction (NPDRR), 2017 on the theme “**Multi Hazard Local Community Capacity Building and DRR planning**” on 24th April, 2017 at India Habitat Centre, Amaltas Hall, New Delhi. The aim of the workshop was to sensitize the participants about initiatives undertaken at various levels for capacity building of the communities and addressing different components of community based DRR planning for building resilient communities. The workshop was attended by 55 delegates from the government sector, non government sector, international organizations, community leaders and children.

The objectives of the workshop were as follows:

1. To bring different stakeholders working in the field of developing capacities for DRR at community level,
2. To understand the mechanism of hazard, vulnerability capacity and risk analysis undertaken by various organizations at the community level,
3. To explore the challenges faced in capacity development of the communities for DRR,
4. To share best practices on community based DRRs in India share lessons learnt,, and;
5. To strengthen multi-sectorial collaboration for DRR in India.

The recommendations which flew unabated from the workshop were as follows:

1. Scientific innovations and technology need to customize their outputs according to the needs of the community.
2. A disaster Museum needs to built to preserve the memories of past disasters and the lessons learnt from them.
3. Awareness generation for Disaster Risk Reduction needs to be done through different channels who have an outreach at the grassroot level like media, RSS pracharaks, PM’s Mann ki Baat etc.
4. A multistakeholder local level community platform needs to be but for carrying out DRR activities.
5. Need to create sustainable livelihoods and strengthen ecosystem to promote DRR at the community level.
6. There is a need to integrate the expertise of capacity development professionals with DRR professional and practitioners for developing capacities at the community level.
7. Donors need to sensitized regarding allocation of time and resources for understanding the local context by the DRR practitioner in community based DRR projects and progarmmes.
